Expenditure and Impact 2016-2017

Objective 1: Provide opportunities for students to take part in intra/inter School competitions		
Activity	Cost	Evaluation of impact and next steps
Subscription to Bottisham partnership	£1,300	<p>The impact of the school's involvement with the Bottisham Village College Partnership allows the children to access a variety of sporting events and competitions. This year we accessed:</p> <p>Year 4 Basketball festival Year 2 Multi Sports festival Year 3 Tennis</p> <p>Although we have attended tournaments organised by the Bottisham partnership this year, we have decided that it is not cost effective to join two partnerships as of next year so will not be renewing the subscription.</p>
Subscription to Netherhall Partnership	£850	<p>This year we attended some events organised by the partnership:</p> <p>Cross country - Year 3,4,5 and 6 Gymnastics - Year 3 and 4 - ranked 3rd Overall</p> <p>This package provides good support for the subject leaders but we have struggled to access most of the tournaments and competitions this year. This is going to be a focus for the next academic year.</p>
Cambridge United football tournament	NO COST	Year 6 boys attended a football tournament run by Cambridge United and ranked 4 th Overall.
Transport coach costs for events	£600	<p>Transport was funded to attend the basketball, multisport, cross country and the year 3 tennis.</p> <p>Use of funding in this way has been positive and kept cost for parents to zero.</p>
Lunchtime sports coaches	£3380	<p>Money was used to employ an extra lunchtime sports coach to organise a range of sports competitions during lunchtimes for both KS1 and KS2.</p> <p>Having coaches present during lunchtimes has had a positive impact on the amount of sport children participate in. Children are regularly taking part in inter school competition in a range of sports. Giving the children opportunities to take part in a competitive environment has improved resilience and relationships.</p>
Inter school competitions during PE lessons	NO COST	<p>Several inter school competitions were held in KS2 this year at the end of PE units:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Creative games - Gymnastics - Handball - Swimming <p>KS1 held an athletics event at the end of their unit.</p>

		Holding end of unit competitions has proved very positive this year and it something that we will continue to develop next year. Money needs to be assigned to this area in order to raise the profile of competition within school.
Sports day	NO COST	Whole school sports day held during the summer term. The event was well attended by parents and all children participated in two or more races. Changes were made to sports day this year by including toddler races which was very successful.
Race for life	NO COST	The whole school took part in a race for life event this year where children received medals for taking part.

Objective 2: Increase the opportunities for students to attend a variety of extra-curricular activities using a variety of sports

Activity	Cost	Evaluation of impact and next steps
Afterschool Tag Rugby club	£640.50	This club ran during the autumn term for KS2 pupils
Afterschool Multisport club	£1355.50	This club ran throughout the whole academic year for KS1 pupils.
Afterschool dance club	£889	This club ran throughout the whole academic year for KS1 and KS2 pupils.
Afterschool gymnastics club	£0	This club ran during Autumn 2 and Spring 1 for year 3 and year 4 pupils which resulted in 2 teams attending the Netherhall gymnastics competition.
Afterschool dodge ball club	£840	This club ran during the Spring term and the Summer term for KS1 and KS2 pupils
Before School netball	£350	This club ran during the Spring term for KS2 pupils

Evaluation comment: This has been a very significant proportion of the expenditure at Fen Ditton and feedback from parents regarding our extracurricular clubs is very positive. The majority of clubs have been either subsidised or fully funded and this has allowed a greater majority of pupils to attend. We have found that after successfully attending one club, many pupils went on to be regular club attenders and this has contributed to healthier lifestyles and attitudes to sport.

Activity	Cost	Evaluation of impact and next steps
Staff CPD with Bottisham Village College PE specialists	Cost covered through subscription to BVC partnership	Over the course of the year a specialist came in to work with 5 of the teaching staff to deliver gymnastics lessons. The specialist also worked with the PE subject leader on a new assessment plan. Staff have gained some knowledge and expertise and a questionnaire will be carried out to identify new areas for staff development.
PE Networking event	Cost covered through Netherhall partnership	1 x day Networking event and training for PE subject leader This was a beneficial session that included information about how best to spend PE funding.
